About the Position

A newly created position, the Senior Director of Development, Corporate and Foundation Relations (Senior Director) will manage and proactively grow corporate and foundation frontline fundraising for Joslin Diabetes Center to achieve its priorities. This person will report to Chief Development Officer Betsy Cote, and will work closely and collaboratively with Joslin leadership, chiefs, physicians, researchers and key others to engage and create strategic philanthropic partnerships with Joslin.



The Senior Director will serve as a strategist for all philanthropic

fundraising for institutional prospects and donors and serve as the main point of contact for corporations and foundations seeking partnerships with Joslin. They will play a critical role in the identification, cultivation, and stewardship of private and corporate foundations, including developing proposals for designated funding.

The Senior Director will also lead the implementation of best practices regarding Corporate and Foundation Relations operations within the larger Development framework. Additionally, the Senior Director will work collaboratively with the Senior Director of Development, Special Events to manage and maintain corporate partnerships pertaining to cause marketing opportunities.

Key Responsibilities

- Serve as key member of Joslin fundraising leadership team, providing strategy and vision to build a robust and successful foundation and corporate relations program.
- Proactively initiate and execute the identification and solicitation activities for leading foundations and corporations that will result in significant resources (six-, seven-, and eight-figure commitments) to Joslin's highest priorities in patient care, research and education.
- Strategically identify and research new foundations; develop strategies to respond to new collaborative initiatives among foundations.
- Oversee the development of competitive and compelling requests for foundation funding.
- Establish trust and close working relationships with clinicians and researchers at Joslin to remain informed of relevant funding opportunities.
- Manage all stewardship requirements for corporations and foundations supporting Joslin.
- Partner with the Chief Development Officer to identify and implement best Corporate and Foundation Relations practices across the institution.
- Manage a portfolio of foundations, select family foundations, corporate foundations and potential others while assisting Corporate and Foundation Relations staff in developing, expanding and fully realizing the philanthropic potential of their portfolios.
- Identify and leverage trustee and donor connections with priority prospects as appropriate.
- Assist in planning, monitoring, and managing budget in Corporate and Foundation Relations unit. Serve as the primary liaison to the Finance Department to ensure proper transfer and reporting on budget and oversight of funds in collaboration with the Senior Director of Development, Operations.

Key Qualifications

- Minimum of 7 years of experience in foundation and corporate philanthropy, including portfolio management, relationship development and stewardship, and grant and report writing.
- Proven ability and desire to lead, manage, and grow a corporate and foundation fundraising program.
- Ability to collaborate closely with colleagues in development and across departments.
- Knowledge of current trends in foundation funding, as well as institutional funders committed to supporting organizations with a similar mission to Joslin.
- Ability to persuasively articulate the organization's mission, program objectives, and resource needs to potential donors.
- Ability and desire to work well in an ambiguous environment with a complicated array of internal stakeholders.
- Track record of engaging internal stakeholders in the grants process and superior level of customer service and follow through.
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills including writing, editing, and presenting.
- Exceptional writing skill samples will be requested.
- Experience with scientific and medical subjects a plus.
- Strong connection to and passion for Joslin's mission.
